Wars fought by our grandfathers and great-grandfathers left behind a heavy legacy. The sacrifices made in battle came with emotional scars and an often unspoken burden of trauma. When returning home, many of these men struggled with the emotional fallout, which, in turn, made it difficult for them to demonstrate what it means to be a loving, responsible man. The absence of a nurturing, emotionally available role model left many boys without a clear picture of what manhood looks like.



In recent decades, as movements for equal rights advanced, a narrative emerged that claimed men and women were exactly the same in every respect. While the push for equality was vital in many respects, this message sometimes caused confusion about traditional roles. The emphasis on sameness diluted the importance of traits like strength, responsibility, and protection that have long-



defined manhood. This blurring of roles left many young men questioning whether the qualities traditionally associated with manhood were still relevant or even necessary.

Today, many young men delay the transition into adulthood. In a culture increasingly focused on instant gratification and digital distractions, the call to lead, provide, and serve often takes a back seat. The Results of Directionless Manhood Without purpose, men don't just fade—they break. The stats are sobering:

- 1 Men commit 90% of murders and 88% of robberies.
- 2 Male suicide rates are 4x higher than women's, significantly rising among the young.
- 3 40% of men report weekly loneliness.
- 4 Fatherlessness is tied to addiction, crime, and incarceration.

This crisis isn't because masculinity is toxic—but because it's confused, disconnected, and untrained. The solution? Rediscovering God's vision for manhood.
